Virtual Trip to Dentist

Materials: internet access, website:

Preparation: Preview video.

Instructions:

1. Watch the video with your child.

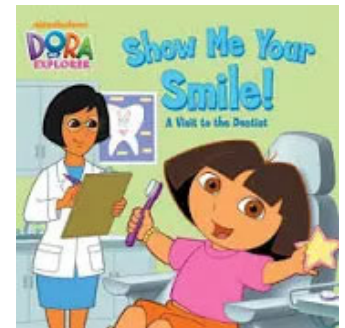

Instructions:

1. View this read aloud book together.
2. Ask questions related to the story, ex: "Why did Dora have an x-ray of her tooth?" "Will Dora get a sticker after her visit?"



Color Search

Preparation: Determine whether to do the search indoors or outside.

Instructions:

1. Encourage your child to search for an object of each color of the rainbow: Red, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue, Indigo, Violet/Purple.
2. Ask, "How many colors were easy to find?"
3. Show another family member your rainbow-colored objects!

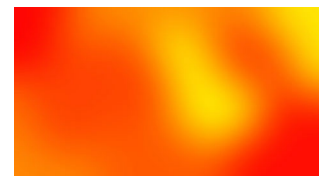


Milk Magic

Materials: food coloring (red, yellow, white, blue), smock, paintbrushes, milk, cotton swabs, dish soap, containers or bowls

Instructions:

1. Encourage your child to add food coloring to milk the milk.
2. Dip a cotton swab into the dish soap and then into the container of milk. The colors will swirl around like magic! Use primary colors (red, yellow, blue), and then watch as the secondary colors (orange, green, purple) form.
3. Show another family member!



Virtual Happy Sing A-long

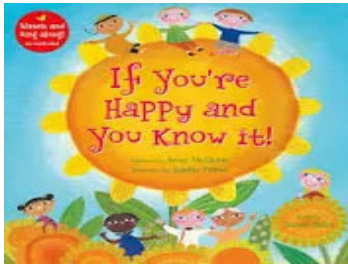

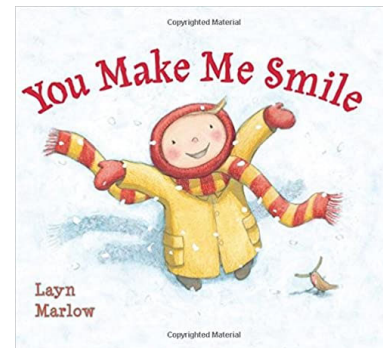

Materials: paint (red, orange, yellow, green, blue, purple), smock, poster

Instructions:

1. Encourage your child to paint a rainbow using the ROY G BIV colors: red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, violet/purple).
2. Ask, "What happens when the colors blend together?"
3. Share your art with another family member or friend!

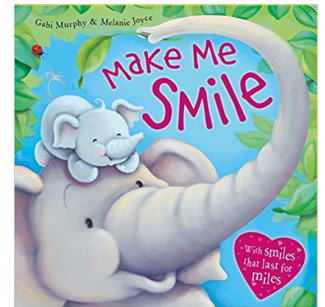

Preparation: Preview video.

Instructions:

1. Listen to this read aloud book with your child.
2. Ask questions related to the story, such as "What was your favorite part?" "Is there a bear in this book?" "Why are monkeys in the book?"



Restaurant Name

Materials: paper, pencil, markers, internet access (optional)

Preparation: Preview restaurant names on the internet to share ideas.

Instructions:

1. Ask your child to create a jazzy name for his/her restaurant.
2. Remind your child that the menu makes a difference in the name.
3. Ask, "What do you want the restaurant environment to be like? Chucky cheese? IHOP?" Name some local restaurants that are not franchisees.
4. Share some of your favorite names of cafes.
5. Design the logo on paper.

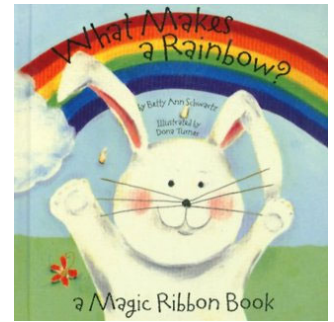

Preparation: Preview video.

Instructions:

1. Listen to this read aloud book.
2. Ask questions related to the story, such as "What was your favorite part of the book?" "Name the colors in the rainbow." "Name animals in the book."



Colorful Emojis

Materials: markers, paper, internet access (optional)

Instructions:

1. Encourage your child to create colorful emojis.
2. Ask your child to list several feelings, such as happy, sad, confused, hurt, fear, disappointed, etc.
3. Add color and details to the faces.
4. Ask "How do we recognize when people feel sad?" "Is it helpful to be able to read faces?"



Tie Dye T-Shirt

Materials: T-shirt or 100% cotton fabric, smock, water, drop cloth, a bucket per color, rubber bands or twine, commercial dye colors or kit

Preparation: Get area ready for a messy event. Outdoors is recommended. Ask your child idea for drop cloth, such as shower curtain. Wear smocks. Prepare bucket of dye.

Instructions:

Encourage your child to tie dye.

Step 1: Tie the fabric with rubber-band or twine. Test one per side of T-shirt.

Step 2: Immerse in **Dye bucket.**

Step 3: Rinse in water.

Step 4: Repeat for new colors.

Step 5: Dry. Enjoy your new colorful creation!

Wash shirt separately!

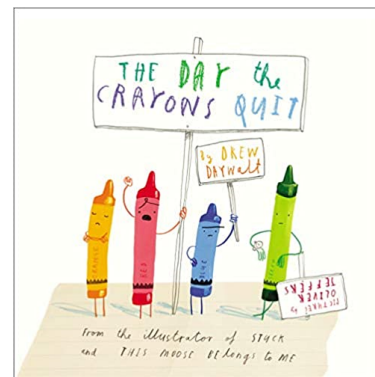

My Book

Materials: paper (8.5 x 11 several sheets), scissors, markers, pencil

Instructions:

1. Encourage your child to create a book by folding several sheets of paper in half.
2. Ask him/her to brainstorm topics, such as pets, family, school, sports, etc.
3. Discuss the beginning, middle, and end of the story.
4. Draw an image on each page.
5. Create the cover with your child's name as writer and illustrator.
6. Share the new book with another family member!
