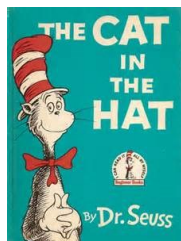
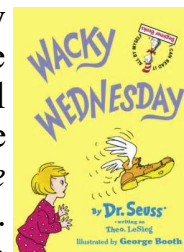
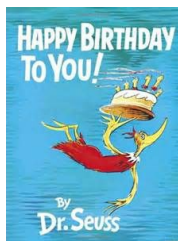
Happy Birthday Dr. Seuss



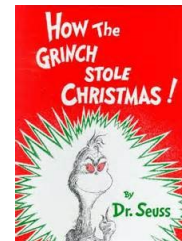
Dr. Seuss is an icon in many of our children's lives. He's a staple amongst educational facilities and an exceptional learning tool. Dr. Seuss was widely known for publishing 46 children's books like *Green Eggs and Ham*, *The Cat in the Hat*, *The Lorax* and many more fun books that children love. Theodor Seuss Geisel was born on March 2, 1904 in Massachusetts. Much of his childhood years revolved around the zoo because he loved animals.



He went to college at Dartmouth where he was inspired by his future wife to write poetry and continue his art rather than pursue an education at an English Teacher. In 1927, he married the love of his life, Helen Palmer. Although, they never had any children he adored them. In his younger years he joined the military as an officer for the Army and wrote several films, musicals and cartoons. In the 1950's his children's literature came alive and wrote *If I Ran a Zoo*, *The Cat in the Hat*, *How the Grinch Stole Christmas* and *Green Eggs and Ham*. In 1991, Dr. Seuss passed away from oral cancer in his home in California. To this day his literature is worldwide and used throughout the educational world. Dr. Seuss and his legacy has inspired movies, musicals, music and enjoyment for children!

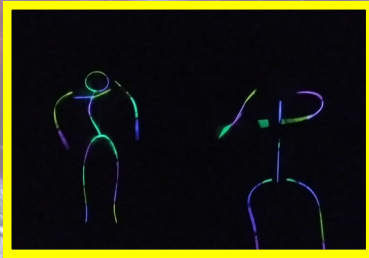
