Day 1 | Week 28

Forest Habitat

Materials: internet access, website: https://youtu.be/6oSUkCaGV18
Preparation: Preview video.

Instructions:

1. Watch the video with your child.

 Ask him/her questions, ex: "What is a habitat?" "What lives in a forest (animals, plants, etc.)?" "What do animals use trees for?" "What animals live in caves or holes?"



Amazing Animals: Forest Adventure



Preparation: Preview video.

Instructions:

1. Listen to the read aloud story with your child.

2. Ask questions about the story, ex: "What animals did you see who live on the ground?" "What animals did you see that live in the trees?" "What was your favorite animal?"



What's in My Bag Rhyming

Materials: bag, items from your household - easy to rhyme (shoe, sock, fork, spoon, etc.) **Preparation:** Place items in the bag.

Instructions:

- 1. Say, "We're going to play a rhyming game. You will pull items out of my bag and tell me the name of the item. Then give me a word that rhymes with it. This word can be a real word or a nonsense word. For example, if you pull out a pen, you could say 'hen' or you could say a silly word like 'nen!"
- 2. Encourage your child to say a rhyming word until all objects have been drawn out of the bag.



Exercise, Rhyme & Freeze

Materials: internet access, website: https://youtu.be/cSPmGPIyykU
Preparation: Preview video.

- 1. Say, "We are going to do some exercises with Jack Hartman using rhyming words."
- 2. Encourage your child to exercise and sing along.
- 3. Once the video has ended, have your child recall some of the rhyming words.

Wow! Said the Owl



- 1. Listen to the read aloud story with your child.
- 2. Ask questions, ex: "What did the owl do instead of sleeping during the day?" "What did she discover?" "What did she do when nighttime came?"



Wise Owl – Where Do I Live?

Materials: Wise Owl template, cardstock, scissors

Preparation: Print the template. Cut out owls and trees.

Instructions:

- 1. Say, "We are going to match up which animals live in the forest and which ones live in the forest."
- 2. Show your child the owls and trees.
- 3. Encourage him/her to place the animals on the correct tree.



Color Owl Twister

Materials: Color Owl Twister template **Preparation:** Print template 6 times. Cut out owls and tape them all around the open area. Place duplicates of these owls in a bag. (Save this activity for Day 5.)

- 1. Pull an owl out and instruct your child on how he/she is to touch that owl.
- 2. Say, "Put your right hand on the orange owl." "Place your left foot on the blue owl."
- 3. Then, continue playing as long as interest remains.

Materials: Get Out of the Box Rhyming



- 3. Encourage your child to locate items that have a good and bad smell.
- 4. Have him/her describe them to you.
- 5. Help your child learn new vocabulary words.
- 6. Then, have your child draw and write the names of the various smelly items.

Materials: Color Owl Twister template from Day 2


Preparation: Tape owls all around the open area. Place duplicates of these owls in a bag.


- 1. Pull an owl out and instruct your child on how he/she is to touch that owl.

The ability to recognize rhyme is an important skill. It enables your child to notice that rhyming words often have shared letter sequences, such as -all in tall, ball, and small, which provides a head start in learning to read.

Instructions:


- 1. Print the activity sheets
- 2. Cut out the picture cards and go over them with your child to make sure she understands what each picture represents.
- 3. Choose three cards to place in the wagon: two that rhyme and one that does not.
- 4. Say the words aloud with your her.
- 5. Have her identify the picture card that does not rhyme and take it out of the box, saying "Get out of the box!"
- 6. Repeat with different groups of cards.


Note: If your child needs extra help with this activity, use the following dialogue:

"Say this word with me: bat." Bat.

"Help me find the picture that rhymes with bat. -At, -at, -at. What sounds like – "at" at the end?"


When she finds the hat say, "Good! Bat and hat sound the same at the end, so they rhyme."




