- 2. Show your baby pictures of themselves and see if he/she responds to the image.





- 1. Assist and modify as needed. Paint the bottom of your baby's foot brown to create the waffle cone for your scoops of ice cream.
- 2. Gently place your baby's foot on the paper.
- 3. Glue the two circles on top of the waffle cone to create an ice cream cone.

- 2. As you sing along together use your finger to represent counting the bees. Observe as your baby participates in fingerplay.




Music Creation
