## LANGUAGE EXPLORATION

#### **Five Little Ducks**

#### **Materials:**

craft sticks (6), glue, scissors, yellow crayon

#### **Preparation:**

Cut 5 small ducks and 1 large one from the Activity pages. Color yellow if desired. Glue each to a craft stick.

#### Instructions:

1. Encourage child to use stick puppets to illustrate the following song:

#### **Five Little Ducks**

Five little ducks went out to play, Over the hills and far away. Mother Duck said, "Quack, quack, quack." But only four little ducks came back. (Repeat until reaching zero.)



# **MUSIC/MOVEMENT**

Farmer in the Dell

Materials: none

Preparation:

#### none

#### Instructions:

1. Lead your infant or toddler in singing the "Farmer in the Dell" song.

2. If you have a toddler, encourage them to join you when you say their name. For example, say, "The farmer takes the cow, John can you make a cow noise?"

3. Praise child for their participation.





# THEME EXPLORATION

#### **Big and Little**

Materials: farm animals (toys, various)

#### **Preparation:**

none

#### Instructions:

1. Place several toy farm animals within your child's reach.

2. As they investigate the animals, talk about different sizes the animals may be. For example, you may have a large cow and a small kitten.

3. If possible, present mothers and babies. This is a great opportunity to show differences in size.

4. Continue activity as long as interest remains.

# **CREATIVE EXPLORATION**

**Spotted Cows** 

Materials: cows (toy, spotted)

Preparation: none

#### Instructions: 1. Show your child the toy cows.

2. Identify them by name and imitate their sounds.

3. Point out the contrasting spots on the cows' hides.

4. Observe your child to see if they look toward the toy cows. Continue activity as long as interest remains.





## **COGNITIVE EXPLORATION**

#### And Baby Makes Three

#### **Materials:**

craft sticks (3), cow images on activity page (cow, bull and calf), tape, scissors

#### **Preparation:**

Cut out each picture of the bull, cow and the calf. Attach the pictures to the craft sticks.

#### Instructions:

1. Show the pictures to your child. Ask them to count the cows with you. Point to each picture and say the number.

2. Then, hold the pictures, count them again while holding up three fingers.

3. Praise child for their rote counting.



# **MUSIC/MOVEMENT**

# Old MacDonald Had a Farm

#### Materials:

Old MacDonald Had a Farm song, farm animals (toys, corresponding to the song)

#### **Preparation:**

none

#### Instructions:

1. Play or sing the song Old MacDonald Had a Farm.

2. As you sing, show them the corresponding farm animal as it appears in the song.

3. Encourage your child to reach for identified animals throughout the song.

4. Continue activity as interest remains.





## THEME EXPLORATION

# **Calling All Piggies**

Materials: picture of a pig

**Preparation:** Locate a picture of a pig.

#### **This Little Piggy**

This little piggy went to market This little piggy stayed home This little piggy had roast beef This little piggy had none And this little piggy cried wee, wee, wee all the way home.

#### Instructions:

1. Show your child a picture of a pig and say, "This is a pig and he says oink, oink."

2. Play "This little piggy" with your child's toes.



# LANGUAGE EXPLORATION

**Snowy Lamb** 

Materials: picture of a lamb

**<u>Preparation:</u>** Locate a picture of a lamb.

> Mary had a Little Lamb Mary had a little lamb, Little lamb, little lamb. Mary had a little lamb It's fleece was white as snow.

#### Instructions:

1. Show your child the picture of the lamb and say "lamb." Make the animal's sound.

2. Sing the nursery rhyme and continue to show the picture.

3. Repeat the nursery rhyme.





## **CREATIVE EXPLORATION**

### Little Chick

#### Materials:

white paper, black marker, glue, paint (yellow and orange), 2 paper plates, smock or old shirt, wet wipes, craft stick

#### **Preparation:**

Cut a chick shape out of the paper. Place paint on paper plates.

#### Instructions:

1. Put a smock or shirt which you don't mind getting dirty on your infant or toddler.

2. Tell your child, "We are going to make a chick. A baby chicken".

3. Dip one of their hands in the paint gently and help him/her paint the chick. Use yellow for the body and orange for the feet and beak. Use the marker to add eyes.

4. Use wet wipes to clean your child's hand.

5. Allow to dry and glue to the craft stick. Use the chick as a puppet with your child.

# **MUSIC/MOVEMENT**

# **Dancing Chickens**

Materials: Chicken Dance song (or similar)

#### **Preparation:**

none

#### Instructions:

1. Begin music and demonstrate the various motions to the Chicken Dance (Make your hands talk four times, flap your arms like wings four times, and wiggle your bottom four times).

- 2. Assist them with dance movements.
- 3. Continue activity as long as interest remains.







#### THE TEMPORAL LOBE

# Supporting the Development of the Temporal Lobe

Two main functions of the temporal lobe are auditory processing and memory. This is the part of the brain that deals with hearing and distinguishing different sounds. From infancy, babies are tuned in to sounds in their environment, and since auditory processing is intertwined with language development, supporting the development of the temporal lobe is important.



#### Hearing Stimulation Quack, Quack, Quack

Materials: stuffed animal (duck)


#### Instructions:

- ✓ Hide duck in home.
- ✓ Gather your infant or toddler.
- ✓ Talk to your infant or toddler about ducks.
- ✓ Make the sound of a duck and encourage child to imitate the sound.
- ✓ Sing "One Duck" in an upbeat tone to the tune of your choice.
- $\checkmark~$  At the end of the song, show child where duck is hidden.


☆ This activity uses singing to stimulate your child's auditory senses.


#### **Activity Song**




Activity page for use with Cognitive Exploration: And Baby Makes Three
