The Definitive History of Pirates

Materials: internet access, website:

Preparation: Preview video.

Instructions:

1. Say, "We are going to watch a video about the history of pirates."
2. Ask questions about the video, ex: "What were the 'Golden Years' of pirates?" "Where were the female pirates?" "Why did people become pirates?"


Materials: internet access, website:

Preparation: Preview video.

Instructions:

1. Read this wonderful story about how a young boy became a pirate!
2. Ask questions about the story, ex: "What was the captain's name?" "Why were the pirates' teeth green?" "What type of food was not allowed onboard the ship?"



Sunken Treasure

Materials: beads, funnel, gold glitter, glue, gold sequins, water, water bottle

Preparation: Gather materials.

Instructions:

1. Have your child use a funnel to add sand to the plastic water bottle.
2. Then, have him/her add the selected treasure items to the water bottle using the funnel or freehand.
3. Use a funnel to add gold glitter.
4. Have your child add water to the bottle along with blue food coloring (optional).
5. Help him/her put on the bottle cap. You may want to hot glue it shut to prevent it from opening.



2. Ask questions about the story, ex: "What was the name of the ship?" "What bridge did the pirates have to cross?" "Where were the Pants of Gold located?"




My Pirate Ship

Lemon Ice

Materials: blender, cup, ice cubes (6-8), lemon juice (3 teaspoons), sugar (3 teaspoons)

Preparation: Prepare area and gather materials.

Instructions:

1. Say, "We are going to make lemon ice!"
2. Crush ice cubes in blender and place into a cup.
3. Sprinkle the sugar on top of the ice.



2. Ask questions about the story, ex: "What did pirates think was weird but never pointed and stared?" "What did pirates always say after they took someone's treasure?"




Pirate Manners

Jolly Roger

Materials: craft sticks (5), glue, markers or paint (black, red), Jolly Roger Template

Preparation: Prepare area, gather materials, and print out template.

Instructions:

1. Say, "We are going to create our own Jolly Roger!"
2. Encourage your child to color or paint craft sticks (2 blk, 2 red).
3. Allow to dry. Then, have him/her glue the 4 sticks horizontally on the remaining craftstick.
4. Glue on the pirate skull template.
