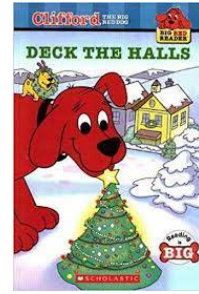
Materials: internet access, website:

Instructions:

1. Listen to the read aloud story with your child.
2. Ask questions, ex: "What was the big job Emily Elizabeth and Clifford have to do for the town?" "What happened to T-Bone?" "How did T-Bone's friends find him?"



Decorations Missing

Materials: craft sticks, Missing Decorations template, glue

Preparation: Print template. Cut out items and glue on craft sticks. Hide one set around the room.

Instructions:

1. Show your child the decorations and talk about each picture, what it represents, and the colors.
2. Next, tell your child you have hidden these decorations around the room, and it is his/her to find each one.

Instructions:

1. Listen to the read aloud story with your child.
2. Ask questions, ex: "What was the secret behind the show?" "What happened to the candy canes?" "Where did the magic come from?"



Candy Cane Art

Materials: Candy Cane template, paper (red), glue, scissors

Preparation: Cut out red strips. Print template.

Instructions:

1. Show your child the Candy Cane template.
2. Say, "You are going to take the red strips of paper and glue them onto your paper to look like a candy cane."
3. When your child has made his/her candy cane, count the strips of red paper together.

Move both flat hands in forward circling movements with palms touching the chest alternating.



Candy Cane Threading

Materials: "o" shaped cereal with different colors (save cereal for use later in the week), pipe cleaner

Preparation: Bend pipe cleaner to look like a candy cane.

Instructions:

1. Show your child the pipe cleaner.
2. Tell your child that he/she will take the cereal pieces and thread them onto the pipe cleaner to create a colorful candy cane.
3. After your child threads the first one, use the pipe cleaner to hook and twist around to prevent the cereal from falling off.

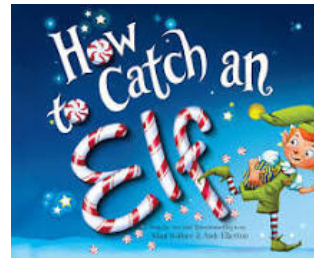

Instructions:

1. Listen to the read aloud story with your child.
2. Ask questions, ex: "Who is trying to catch the elf?" "What traps are set up?" "What did Santa and the Elf eat?"



The Color is Orange

Materials: paper, orange crayon

Preparation: Gather materials.

Instructions:

1. Tell your child that he/she gets to draw anything using the orange crayon.
2. Give your child paper and the crayon.
3. While your child is drawing, ask him/her about his/her artwork.

1. Show your child the cereal and the template color paper.
2. Encourage your child to choose a piece of cereal and match it up to the correct color.
3. Continue until all cereal is sorted correctly.

Instructions:

1. Listen to the read aloud story with your child.
2. Ask questions, ex: "Why was the dog sad?" "What did he discover he could do to help with Christmas?" "What did he eat?"



Ornament Rolling

Materials: balls (different sizes)

Preparation: Locate a safe, open area.

Instructions:

1. Give your child the balls and encourage him/her to roll a ball to you. Then another one.
2. Talk about the different sizes of balls. Ask questions, ex: "What one is the biggest?" "Smallest?"

2. Next, have your child draw a picture using the different colors of crayons.

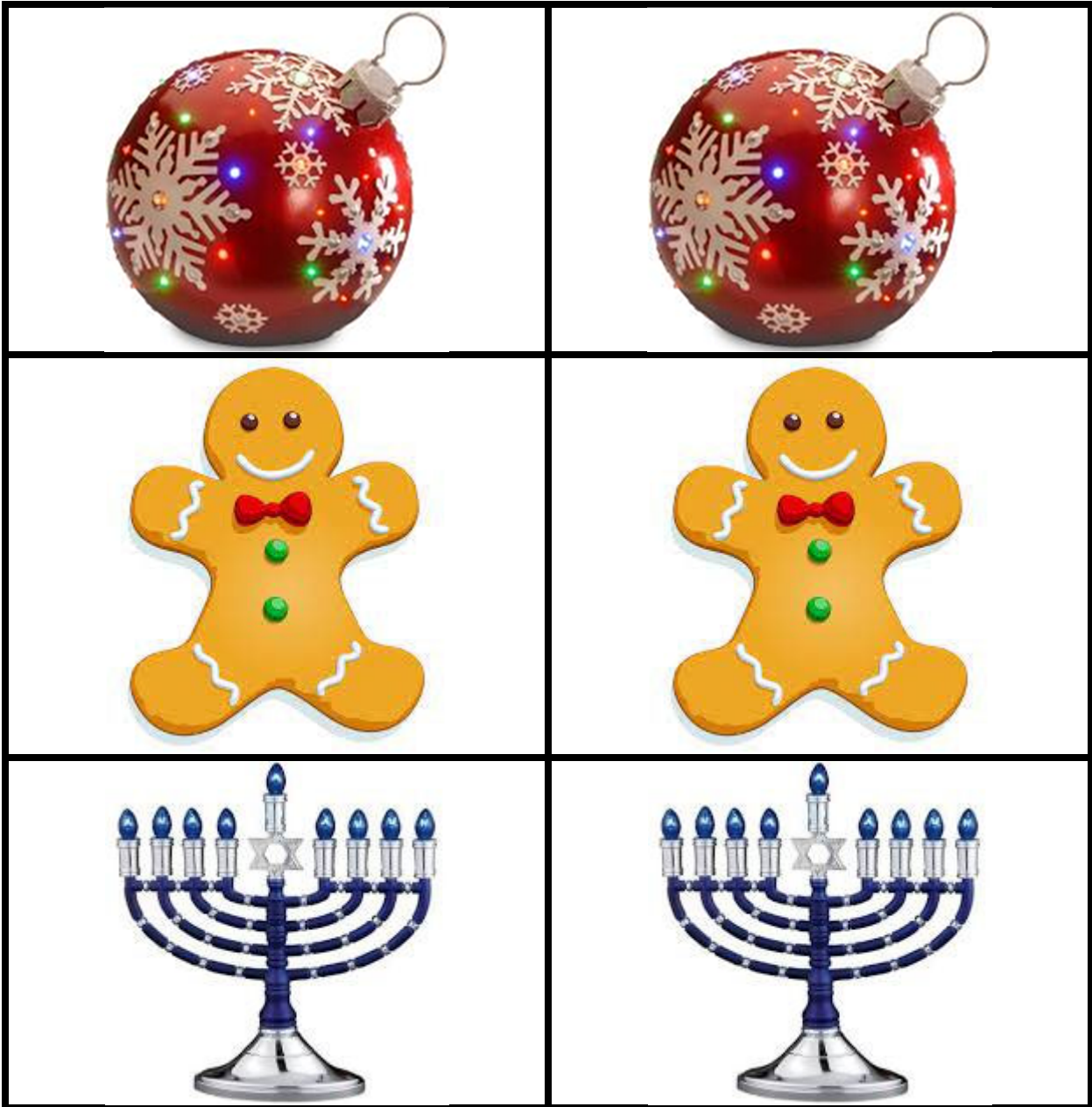

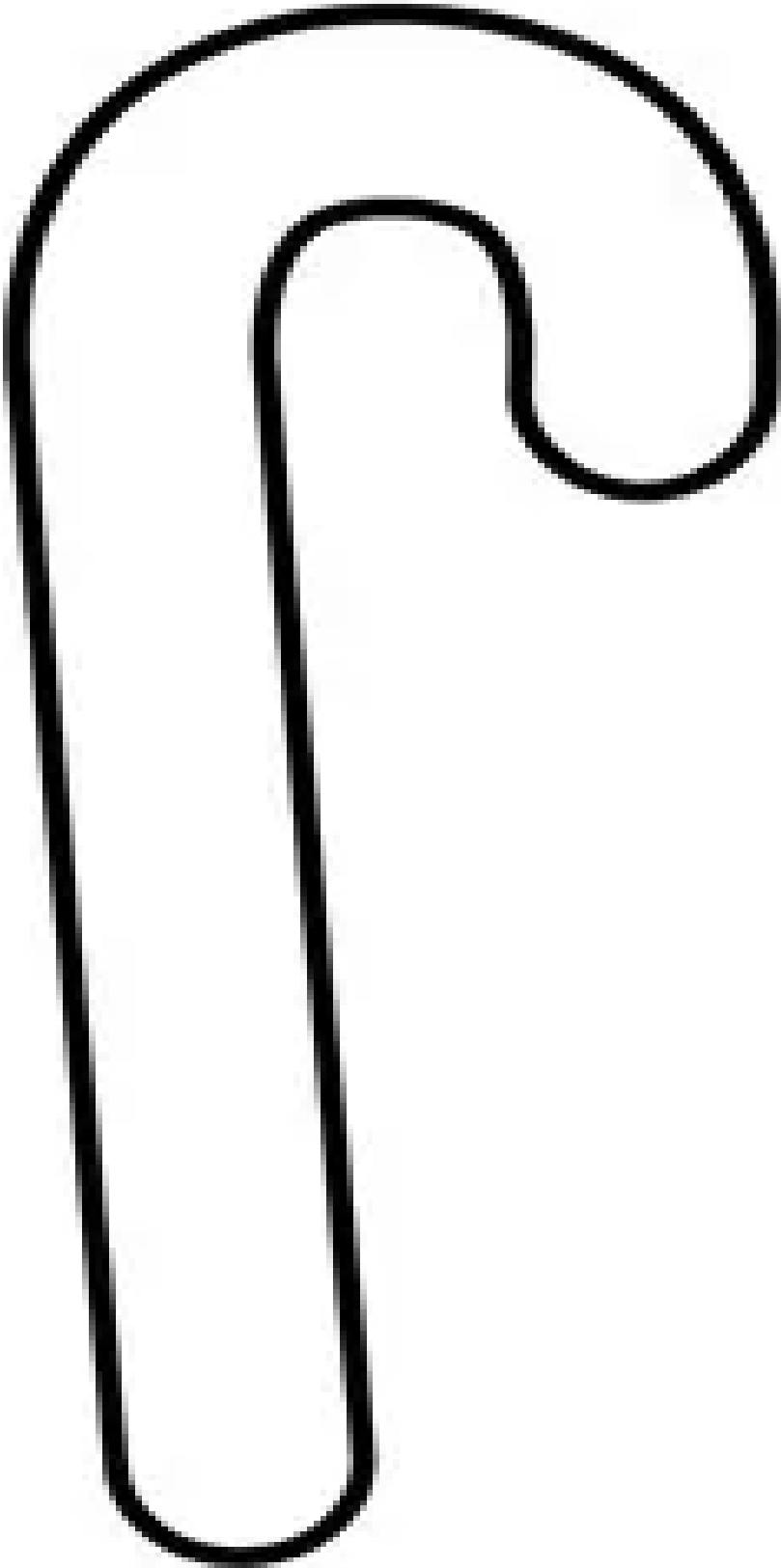
Missing Decorations Template
