When Should I Change My Child's Car Seat?

When looking to buy/ change a car seat, it can often be confusing. There are rear facing, forward facing, convertible and booster seats. Which one is the right choice for your child?

In the state of Georgia, children are required to be rear facing if they are under

one year old, or older than one, but under 20 lbs. It is always recommended that they stay rear facing as long as possible in accordance with your car seat manufacturer.

Look for GROSS MISUSE or NON-USE

Non-use of car seats is the worst type of misuse. Gross misuse may include:

- No seat belt or LATCH attachments anchoring the car seat.
- No harness straps securing the child in the car seat.
- A rear-facing child in the front seat with an active air bag.
- An infant or toddler less than 1 year-old facing forward.

its of the seat, they may switch to a forward facing seat. If your child exceeds the weight or height limits of their front facing seat, it is time to move to a booster.

Once a child is in a booster seat, they should remain in it until they are at least 4'9'. Children also must remain in the back seat until they are at least 8 years old. The recommendation is that they stay in the back seat until the age 13 as this is the safest place for a children to sit.

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Rain, Rain Go Away!

Most activities don't require any extra supplies or minimal supplies such as painter's tape.

March's Theme: Up, Up and Away


