## Summer Yearbook Club

This club will meet each week over the course of the Summer. This club is more developmentally appropriate for the Senior group of campers.

### **Skills Used**

Working in teams; finding and using creativity; creating art through photography

### **Instructions**

- 1. Have the campers decide if they want to participate in the Yearbook Club. Explain that this is a long-term group that will meet each week.
- 2. Separate campers into groups of three or four and give each group a camera.
- 3. Have each group pick a topic for their section of the Yearbook (friends, projects, food, fieldtrips (virtual), teachers, etc.).
- 4. Each week, plan a "fieldtrip" that relates to the Yearbook theme:
  - a. Photography is a type of art Talk about the types of art and that photography is one of them.
  - b. Get to know your group activity Have campers get together in groups to learn more about each other and how they think they can work best together.
  - c. How to take pictures Video Find a YouTube video that talks about the best ways to take pictures and show that to all the campers. Then, have them practice taking different photos.
  - d. Scrapbooking Video Find a video on scrapbooking and show the campers. Then, have them meet in their groups to decide how their scrapbook section will look.

#### **Materials Needed:**

- Disposable/digital camera (one for each group)
- Construction paper
- Scrapbooking materials (you can buy these at any craft store)
- Markers
- Colored pencils
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- Glue
- 5. Have the campers pick a different person to take the camera each week to take pictures relating to their section.
- 6. At the end of the week, have the pictures printed.
- 7. Meet once a week in groups to discuss the pictures and have the groups begin putting together their sections of the yearbook. Have them use construction paper, different decorations, etc. to put together their section of the yearbook.
- 8. At the end of the summer, take all their sections and make a Summer 2020 Yearbook.
- 9. Talk to a local printing company to see if they might donate or make copies of the book for a lower cost. (Maybe allow the printing company to put their name and contact information on the books, so that when the children take the books home, their parents will see the company's information.)
- 10. Give the books to the children at the end of the Summer.
